- Two special sections upcoming: Peds (May or August issue). NIH Toolbox in Rehab Medicine (will set standard for outcomes measurement—big coup, it was going to go to Archives PM&R).
- One page tear sheets done by Science Committee have been successful.
- With transition to new editor, entire editorial board is retired.
- Welcome to Dr. Ehde.
- She will be sending a vision email to listserv.
- New Editorial Board to include more ECPs, as well as those from diverse backgrounds.
- Goal to keep lag time down.
- Increase pool of ad hoc reviewers—work with ECP SIG to recruit.







## APPENDIX B

### February 2017 – APA Division 22 Treasurer's Report

This report summarizes the current status of Division 22 finances and reviews the 2016 Fiscal Year (Jan 1, 2016 – Dec 31, 2016).

Budget figures presented are from statements received in a preliminary report from APA through December 2016. Revenue and expenses recorded and the information from statements received is supplemented by revenues and expenses received and processed through December 31, 2016.

Using available figures for FY2016, present revenue (\$46,653.11) is greater than expenses (\$37,447.42), with a net income of \$9,205.69. It should be noted that reconciliation with APA is based upon a draft budget that is not completely reconciled. Examination of expenditures and income for the year suggests that the Division has enough income/cash reserves to cover expenditure for 2017.

Revenue: Projected revenue for 2016 was kept approximately the same as 2015. Actual income (\$46,653.11) exceeded projected revenue (\$34,165), due to greater than expected revenue from CE fees. CE income was \$11,390, which is \$7,290 higher than projected. Membership dues income for 2016 were \$24,817, which is slightly higher than projected (\$23,000) Given that income from CE fees has exceeded projections by approximately \$7,000 in 2015 and 2016, it appears that overall projected revenue should be increased.

Expenses: Projected expenses for 2016 were \$34,150 and actual expenses (pending final verification) were \$37,447.42, meaning the Division was \$3,297.42 over budget. This discrepancy can be attributed in large part to payment for strategic planning. Overall, it is recommended that the budget projection for 2016 be increased to more accurately project expenses in 2017. This recommendation depends upon resolution of identified action items below that may alter this amount somewhat.

Summary of Financial Condition: According to the most recent financial statements (December 2016), the Division's balance sheet has \$238,350.72 in assets with no long-term liabilities. These values represent an amount equivalent to approximately 6 years of current annual operating expenses and suggests that, at present, the Division is overall in sound shape.

#### Action Items for Discussion:

1. Does the Division wish to adjust the projected per-trip expense upward from \$750?
2. What are the projected expenses for re-branding efforts in 2017?
3. Should the overall projected revenue for 2017 be increased to account for income related to CE fees that has significantly increased in 2015 and 2016?
4. Should the Division reduce the SLN budget from \$2,000 to \$1,000? The SLN spent \$342.56 in 2016 and \$572.64.

Although SLN members have reported a great benefit from FRP and Division funds for their SLN chapter events, it continues to be challenging to get students to remember to take advantage of this opportunity. Specifically, the SLN saw a large increase in fund requests during the Fall semester; however, students are not formally pursuing fund requests as frequently in the Spring. As a committee, we are discussing ways in which we may encourage students to utilize these funds more regularly.	The SLN has had interest from students who would like to start an SLN chapter at their institution, but do not have faculty available who have an interest in rehab psychology and/or are involved with division 22. In these cases, the students often learn about rehab psychology from practicum site supervisors who are not formally affiliated with their home institution. Based on the current guidelines for development of a new SLN chapter, these individuals must have a faculty member at their home institution to sponsor the chapter. This has created a barrier for many students who would benefit from a chapter but cannot meet this requirement. The SLN is brainstorming on ways to overcome this challenge and support students in these situations.

### SOCIETY FOR MILITARY PSYCHOLOGY

*Division 19 of the American Psychological Association*



February 1, 2017

On January 26, 2017, the *Washington Post* and other news organizations published a draft executive order which calls for the review of current interrogation practices set forth in various executive and legislative mandates. If signed by President Trump, this executive order would stand in sharp contrast to a letter sent earlier this month, with signatures from 176 of the nation's most respected retired generals and admirals, which reinforced the United States' bipartisan opposition to torture.

As Division 19, the Society for Military Psychology within the American Psychological Association, whose members include representatives from all military branches, we strongly urge President Trump to restrain from loosening any rules governing the treatment of individuals in military custody. The members of Division 19 assert and affirm that torture or abusive treatment is deeply inconsistent with the ethics and values inherent to military service, our profession as psychologists and our stature as American citizens.

In direct contrast to statements made by the administration, experienced intelligence professionals and politicians from both sides of the aisle agree that torture is not effective and, more importantly, does not represent who we are as a nation – it is immoral. Moreover, the science of gathering human intelligence does not support any claims of effectiveness. The respect for human rights and the acquisition of actionable intelligence are not mutually exclusive, despite claims by some that they are.

Last year, Senators McCain (R-AZ) and Feinstein (D-CA) sponsored legislation that reinforces the United States' ban on the use of torture. That legislation passed the Senate with the support of a broad bipartisan majority. APA proudly supported that legislation, as did the membership of Division 19.

Speaking with one voice, we urge President Trump, in the strongest terms, to maintain the current legislative framework that recognizes the need for national security and respect for human rights.

**Executive Summary**

**Past 6 mo**

1. Jennifer Duchnick attended APA consolidated meetings in Washington, DC, in September 2016. CDIP was supported by a temporarily assigned staff person since the resignation of Anju Kubchandani.

2. During consolidated meetings, committees were informed of changes are occurring in the structure of APA committee meetings, with movement toward virtual versus face-to-face meetings. CDIP is advocating for need to ensure that any platform selected can be adapted to meet the needs of individuals with hearing impairment, visual impairment, or other special considerations related to disability.

3. CDIP desires to continue collaboration with Div 22 surrounding events at APA. Last year's CDIP award presentation at Div 22/ABRP Social was well attended and perceived to be a success. CDIP can contribute monetarily to offset costs of increased attendance at social hour. Last year the budget was \$500. It is anticipated to be the same this year, though staff are still working to confirm this.
