**1:10 CALL TO ORDER, WELCOME, INTRODUCTIONS, ATTENDANCE**

Dr. Brenner called meeting to order.

Participants introduced themselves.

**1. 1:15- 1:20 Approval of Minutes (Dr. Rath)**

**MOTION: Approve February 2017 EC minutes with minor edits as noted.**

Passed without objection.

**2. 1:20-1:25 APA Convention Update (Drs. Raskin and Betthausen)**

Drs. Raskin and Betthausen gave an update on Convention. Division 22's 17 allocated hours were increased to 33 with collaborative programming. Thank you to Drs. Vega, Sung, and others

**3. 1:25-1:40 International Committee/IPA Exchange (Drs. Sung and Press)**

Introductions and welcome: Israeli Psychological Association delegates.

Drs. Sung and Press provided overview of delegation's visits to sites in NYC area and

Washington, DC. Dr. Stiers hosted at JHU, Dr. Press at Rusk. Visits to Kessler, Mount Sinai, JFK, etc. (*SEE APPENDIX C*). Poster session in Hospitality Suite.

**4. 1:40-1:45 Early Career Proposal (Dr. Sung)**

Request for funding ECP activities (*SEE APPENDIX D*)

Current budget is 0. Request for \$2000.

Dr. Meade: How large is ECP group? 8 active members (Dr. Sung), but 22% of Division members are ECPs (Dr. Stiers)

**MOTION: Table ECP funding request until budget discussion with incoming Division President, Dr. Meade.** Include FRP funding in discussion.

Motion passed without objection.

**5. 1:45-1:50 Membership Committee (Dr. Daniels)**

Very slight decline: Last year: 1047 paid memberships, 1043 this year  
Good relative to larger APA.

Dr. Efrat Eichenbaum is incoming chair of the membership committee, Dr. Daniels will be past chair. Dr. Sarah Heinz incoming chair-elect

Letter went out to 30 ABRPs who are not members of Division (from Division and ABRP, co-signed by Dr. Daniels and Dr. Rusin) (*SEE APPENDIX E*)

90 RP17 attendees are not members. Targeted registration during conference? Is there an option to sign up for Division during conference registration, with discount? Explore. Membership committee will invite RP attendee/non-members to join

**6. 1:50-1:55 Council of Rehabilitation Psychology Postdoctoral Training Programs (Dr. Stiers)**

12 member programs.

New draft of RP competencies. Developing a measure to be piloted with 12 member programs. Dr. Gorgens—make sure the new competencies and measures are in line with ABRP behavioral competencies.

Note: Dr. Stiers is Division liaison to APA E&T committee

**7. 1:55-2:05 Interdivisional Health Committee (Dr. Nierenberg)**

Overview of IHC (started by Robert Glueckauf)

Opportunity for Division: Opioid addiction in current national zeitgeist—exemplar of biopsychosocial approach.

Division 38 is much larger division. Leads a lot of initiatives: For example, Dr. Doug Tynan,

Director, Integrated Health Care, needed a program on helping psychologists talk to physicians. Perfect for Division 22, but Division 38 had training program for graduate students ready to go. This program was adapted into “transforming primary care practice” training available online.

**ACTION ITEM:** CMS email from Dr. Kathy Nordal, regarding CPT codes. All Division members, if you received email, please respond. Comment period ending soon.

**8. 2:05-2:10 Student Leadership Network (S. DeDios Stern)**

One new chapter added since EC meeting in February. Total now = 13 SLN chapters. Planning webinar on RP Foundational Principles with Dr. Dana Dunn.

**9. 2:10-2:15 BPA Update (Dr. Karol)**

Licensing of masters level psychologists (many underserved areas). Working group assembled to give input to Council (Dr. Gorgens—this might be addressed today at Council), but affirms doctoral-level criteria. 24 states license “applied behavior analysts.”

Neuropsychology specialty application (renewal every 7 years), includes psychotherapy for people with disabilities, cognitive rehabilitation).

Dr. Brenner—we don’t do a good job commenting on other specialty applications.

Dr. Curtis—period of public comment. Strongly recommend that Division 22 members comment. In 2022, we have to resubmit and show how we are different from other specialties. Important to comment on encroachment, eroding of specialty.

Q: Dr. Reid-Arndt—is it the unique combination skills or “only ones” who provide a service?

A: Dr. Stiers: Specialties include constellation of shared and unique competencies.

Dr. Corrigan: NP specialty application argues that “adjustment counseling” can be done by any clinical psychologist. On the other hand, they argue that neuropsychological assessment is exclusive to neuropsychologists.

**ACTION ITEM: Practice Committee to form a task force to follow, track, and address encroachment/eroding of RP specialty.** In particular, provide Division 22 membership with info on public comment period for NP specialty renewal. Dr. Brownsberger suggests bulleted talking points that membership can use in comments

Clinical Practice Guidelines. PTSD guideline is out. Two more (obesity and depression) coming up (going out for public comment: Dr. Gorgens, concerns about obesity guidelines/body shaming, etc). Does Division want to propose a guideline? (see recent past EC meeting minutes for previous discussion)

**10. 2:15-2:25 Council Update (Drs. Mona & Gorgens)**

***SEE APPENDIX F***

3 items up for membership vote:

1. How are seats determined: Size of state/Division. Determined by apportionment ballots. This year, 7 Divisions lost a second seat.
2. \$2 fee refunded when you join a division....Eliminate this?
3. Dues exempt over age 65.

“Civility guidelines workgroup”: e.g., monitoring listserv. Create guidelines to post once per year. For Division 22, monitoring listserv is President’s role.

**ACTION ITEM:** Communications Committee to draft “civility guidelines” for listserv, social media, etc. To be posted annually on Division Announcement listserv.

Masters level issue. West Virginia licenses masters-level psychologists.  
CACREP issue from a few years ago. Only CRC certified faculty can teach in CACRP programs. CACRP Will take over masters-level licensure.  
Kim distributed anti-trust guidelines.

Dr. Gorgens = New chair: Health care/health science caucus.

**11. 2:25-2:40 Keith Cooke. Communications and Publications Manager APA Division Services Office. Div 22’s rep in Division services**

Membership processing, newsletters, webinars. All fee for service.

Keith: Membership brochures, fliers, etc.

Sonya Wiggins—webinars

Keith has a menu of services that he can share. Rate is personalized upon discussion.

Paula Aviles—membership issues, recruitment/retention

Finance office provides some free services

**APA Senior Legislative and Federal Affairs Officer**

Craig Fisher: Funding issues. Appropriations NIH/NSF lobbying.

Chair, Friends of NICHD.

NIDILRR long-range plan, included comments from APA and Division.

Can do Advocacy training upon request. APA Science GRO been working with Public Interest GRO re: healthcare and budget issues.

Dr. Smith—Rehab Science Spotlight, under leadership of Dr. Kier Bison. 22 of these produced

1 so far.

2 Also tear sheets in *Rehabilitation Psychology* to continue.

3 Future Plans: More liaisons to other Division Committees, Develop online repository of funding  
4 opportunities?

6 **13. 2:50-3:10 Treasurers Report (Dr. Monden)**

7  
8 ***SEE APPENDIX G***

9 Net income 20K. CEs generated \$6-7K more income than budgeted. Can continue to count on  
10 this income going forward.

11  
12 Projected income = 36K (plus additional \$6-7K noted above, so \$42-43), expenses 40K

13  
14 Q: How to make it easier to donate? Dr. Stiers: How about a sustaining membership? \$5/month  
15 or something?

16  
17 **14. 3:10-3:25 Update regarding administrative support (Dr. Brenner)**

18  
19 Where do we want to spend money to make money?

20 Travel in particular is heavy in budget. Examine travel expenses carefully. Do they feedback  
21 benefits to Division or it is not cost effective (e.g., liaisons to Committees when Committee  
22 Chair already reports to the Division)?

23 Dr. Stiers noted earlier that Division performs “above its weight class.” Is this due to Division  
24 reps being at so many meetings? Counterpoint: APA moving toward remote meetings, so travel  
25 expenses may not be necessary.

26  
27 Administrative support: For example, Division 12 uses a management firm. ACRM uses a  
28 management firm (in addition to entire professional staff).

29 We over-rely on individual member/volunteers to run things. For example, how would  
30 conference run without Terrie Price, Michele Rusin, Barry Nirenberg?

31  
32 Dr. Brenner: Daily tasks of running Division impacts leadership pipeline. Volunteering is  
33 prohibitive in terms of time commitment. Dr. Monden—allow Division leadership to shift from  
34 a focus on nuts and bolts.

35  
36 Dr. Brenner presented a sample proposal from MCC Association Management (she knows this  
37 group from her work with IBIA)

38  
39 Division cannot afford this level of service (includes planning conference) at \$35K per year.  
40 However a more affordable, modest level of service be co-utilized by FRP, Division, ABRP, etc.

41  
42 To get an idea of what is possible from a management company within our budget, we need to  
43 develop an RFA, detailing specifics. We need to have this done within this budget line amount”  
44 (things like Website, app, etc.).

45  
46 Current Division budget can be examined find money to support management company: We

1 have regular CE income now (noted above).

2 Dr. Rohe: Division has 240K in reserve. Consider investing \$50K over ten years, with goal of  
3 building Division infrastructure so that additional income will be self-sustaining.

4 Include Foundation in RFP? For example, Dr. Corrigan sees benefits of FRP having a “real”  
5 bookkeeper.

6  
7 **MOTION:** Presidential triumvirate will form an ad hoc task force to develop an RFA to engage  
8 a management company.

9 Task Force to include Division Treasurer, and realistic appraisal of current budget and  
10 “what can we afford?” RFA to be budgeted at no more than 24K annually from Division funds  
11 (potentially higher including reserves and possible partner contributions from FRP, etc.).

12 Motion approved without objection.

13  
14 **15. 3:25-3:35 Update: Strategic Planning (Dr. Brenner)**

15 ***Plus: Partnerships with ABRP, The Academy, The Foundation***

16  
17 Fundraising. Working with partners (Academy, ABRP, FRP). For RP18 meeting, Drs. Brenner  
18 and Brown still working on MOU. Fundraising is a shared value for meeting. Share fund raising  
19 across Division and Academy. Will require more fund raising from Division.

20

This Committee, in keeping with the Handbook specification of 3-year terms, was reconstituted when Dr. Brenner thanked long-standing members for their years of service but authorized Dr. Niemeier to assemble a new group. The Chair did re-invite some of these veteran members but added new members for a balance of seniority. Primary goals of the current Fellow's Committee are to increase numbers of Division 22 Rehabilitation Psychologists who achieve Fellow status, as well as transparency and accessibility to resources and guidance for candidates/applicants related to the criteria, how to build credentials, and the way to demonstrate impact and significance of one's work in advancing the field of Rehabilitation Psychology.

A one-hour Fellow's Q & A was held in the Hospitality Suite during the 2016 APA Convention in Denver, Colorado. During this time and after the Convention, nine Division 22 members either directly expressed interest in applying for Fellow Status, or were nominated by existing 22 Fellows for this process. Dr. Niemeier contacted each of these candidates and provided information through a Handout showing dates of importance, qualifications, and links to the online portal. She contacted each nominee individually and assisted those who decided to apply with links to review APA and Division Criteria, and guidance.

Ultimately 4 Division 22 Fellow applicants completed their online information. These individuals were: Dr. Sarah Raskin, Dr. Kim Gorgens, Dr. Glenn Curtiss, and Dr. Barry Nierenberg. There were two Division 22 Fellow's Committee meetings related to the discussion and voting for approval for these candidates. In each case, they were attended by 8/9 members. The voting meeting was held on 2/25/17 by teleconference. Members were assigned as primary, secondary, and third reviewers of each of the candidates. Some members recused themselves due to conflict but all candidates were fully reviewed and discussed. All 4 candidates were approved to move on to APA for further review. These candidates will be voted on by the APA Fellow's Committee during the Convention and the Division 22 Fellow's Chair will then be notified of who are new Fellows are soon after this vote. Feedback was provided to the APA Committee secretary about some challenges with the on-line portal as multiple endorsers had difficulty using and uploading documents on the portal.

## Membership Committee Report

### Executive Summary

We have continued membership recruitment efforts from prior years with some success, and we are actively engaged in identifying other avenues and actions that might foster further growth in membership, the largest of which currently includes an outreach effort to Mid-Winter Meeting attendees who are not Division 22 Members. Pacing out for a full 12-month span, membership numbers appear relatively stable year-over-year.

### Past Year

In the past year, modeling the triumvirate model of other leadership positions in Division 22, Carey Pawlowski transitioned to Past-Chair status. Bradley Daniels took over her duties as chair, and Efrat Eichenbaum took a Co-Chair/Incoming Chair role. As the year is now ending, Carey Pawlowski is transitioning out of the triumvirate and Sara Heinz was recruited by current leaders and tentatively agreed to step into an Incoming Chair role, while Efrat Eichenbaum advances to Chair and Bradley Daniels to Past-Chair.

ECP survey: A survey of Division 22's Early Career Practitioner members to better identify needs of ECPs and how the Division can best meet those needs is in development. Angela Kummel and Connie Sung are coordinating this effort. Theresa Ascherman (a Membership Committee member) has agreed to join this workgroup/subcommittee. Connie Sung has emailed Keith Cooke regarding a Division 22 ECP members list.

Division 22 Leadership Manual: Carey Pawlowski, Brad Daniels, and Efrat Eichenbaum collaborated to update the Membership Committee section of the revised Division 22 Leadership Manual, with Carey doing the lion's share of the work. This has been sent to Michelle Meade.

Outreach to ABRP certification holders: An outreach effort was completed to target individuals holding ABRP certification who are not Division 22 members. Brad Daniels and Michelle Rusin collaborated on an email sent to Lanette Melville (ABRP affiliate). Lanette Melville will send this email on behalf of ABPP to *all* members holding ABRP certification.

APA 2017 Division Services Booth: Brad Daniels sent an updated Division 22 brochure to Keith Cooke for distribution at APA 2017.

Dues Year 2017 is nearly complete. Membership data for most of the year (August 2016-May 2017; just missing June and July 2017) is available and shows a slight decline in membership; however, if you project expected month-to-date-paid memberships for June and July 2017 into this based on last year's June and July data, our total anticipated number for Dues Year 2017 should be right around what it was for Dues Year 2016, suggesting stability year-over-year.

### Future Plans

The membership committee is pursuing a number of projects to continue to increase membership. Primary among these includes direct outreach to non-member attendees of the Division 22 Mid-Winter Meetings. This effort was informed by our analysis of non-member attendance of the 2017 Mid-Winter Meeting. Our initial findings were that approximately 85 out of 288 Mid-Winter Meeting attendees were not Division 22 members. As such, the following items are planned:

Email outreach to non-member attendees of the 2017 Mid-Winter meeting: This is ongoing; a number of Membership Committee members will be involved in this effort.

Direct outreach to non-member attendees of the 2018 Mid-Winter meeting: We suggest hosting a raffle drawing for Mid-Winter meeting attendees who register for membership at the conference. The raffle could be announced at the same time as the Book Raffle during the Poster Session/Social Hour. **ACTION ITEM- Brad to ask whether funding is available for a raffle prize (e.g., \$200 for 4x \$50 or 2 x \$100 gift cards).** The Membership Committee could also feature a



table at the door of the Poster Session/Social Hour with application forms and an available laptop for new member signups.

Adding a question about Division 22 Membership on the 2018 Mid-Winter Meeting online registration form (e.g., “Are you a member of Division 22?”): This will enable the Membership Committee to efficiently track and reach out to non-member conference attendees in future years. **ACTION ITEM- Brad to ask Jake Bentley (or email Lanette Melville) at the APA EC Meeting regarding the feasibility of adding this question to the 2018 online registration form at.**

# Israel Delegates



**Yotam Ben-Shats, MA** is the representative of the rehabilitation psychology division of the Israeli Psychological Association (IPA) board. His PhD study, supervised by Hadas Okon-Singer, PhD and Bat-Sheva Hadad, PhD from Haifa University, uses a psychophysics perspective to investigate the relationship between anxiety and perceptual biases. Yotam is also a rehabilitation psychologist intern at the neurological rehabilitation unit of the Sheba Medical Center in Ramat-Gan, Israel, where he specializes in psychotherapy, cognitive rehabilitation and neuropsychological assessment of adults suffering from SCI, TBI and various neurological disorders. Most of his clinical work focuses on the neuro-oncology population, people who suffer from benign/malignant brain/

spinal tumors and people who suffer neurological deficits due to cancer treatments. Among his special interests are end of life issues and treatment of family members and caregivers.



**Hila Cohen, PhD** received her doctoral degree in Rehabilitation Neuropsychology from Ben-Gurion University of the Negev. During her internship, Hila worked with children with a variety of congenital and acquired brain injuries and with adults suffering from traumatic brain injury. Hila is a Senior Neuropsychologist at the Pediatric Neuropsychology Unit, Edmond and Lili Safra Children's Hospital, Sheba Medical Center, since 2012. She both administers and supervises neuropsychological assessments for children with acquired brain injuries (mostly TBI, CVA and Posterior Fossa tumors) and congenital neurodevelopmental disorders (mostly CP). Hila specializes in evaluations of children with severe language and physical impairments. In

addition, she performs psychotherapy for children and their parents, she delivers lectures on pediatric rehabilitation and neuropsychological assessment and she is involved in research conducted in the department. Her main focus of interest is the emotional, social and neuropsychological outcomes of posterior fossa tumors in children.



**Adi Granat, PhD** received her doctoral degree in rehabilitation-clinical psychology from Bar-Ilan University, Ramat-Gan, Israel. She specializes in clinical psychology and has acquired expertise in rehabilitation psychology and neuropsychology. Adi is a senior psychologist at Loewenstein Hospital Rehabilitation Center, where she has been working for the last 11 years. She supervises interns and students in psychotherapy and diagnosis on the pediatric rehabilitation service (Department and Outpatient clinics). Her clinical work is focused on neuropsychological assessment and treatment of children and youth, who have experienced various types of injuries and diseases. During her work she combines the following therapeutic methods: cognitive-behavioral therapy

(e.g. PE, ACT), EMDR, hypnosis and family/parental interventions. Her main research and treating interest includes TBI, PTSD, PCS and unexplained medical symptoms in the field of pediatric rehabilitation. Additionally, Adi teaches graduate courses in rehabilitation psychology (e.g. theories,

assessments and psychotherapy methods of pediatric rehabilitation) and supervises thesis works of MA students. She is presently researching subjects such as posttraumatic growth, the predictors for developing PTSD, the relationship between exposure to trauma and somatization among families and children.



**Eyal Heled, PhD** is a faculty member in the Department of Behavioral Sciences at Ariel University – Rehabilitation Psychology Graduates Program; Head psychologist of the Neurological Rehabilitation Unit at the Rehabilitation Hospital of Sheba Medical Center, which includes an in-patient Neurological Rehabilitation Department (SCI, Stroke, MS, GBS) and three Day Rehabilitation Units specialize in populations with SCI, TBI, PD and neuro-oncology. He also Practices a private clinic for rehabilitation and non-rehabilitation patients. His educational background includes Ph.D from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem and additional clinical trainings (PE, CBT, NLP, Bio-Feedback, Hypnosis, Schema-

Therapy, and Eating Disorder studies). Eyal's clinical work comprises of supervision of interns from the Rehabilitation Hospital and practicum M.A students at Ariel University, in psychotherapy, neuro-cognitive rehabilitation and neuropsychological assessment. He also treats patients in the ward and in ambulatory setting, and have a special interest in applying psycho-dynamic view for understanding rehabilitation patients' subjective experience. His research interests focus on improving neuropsychological evaluation tools for rehabilitation populations (e.g. TBI, stroke, and MS), Executive Function, and cognitive characteristics of eating disorders. Eyal has published number of papers in these fields and also supervise thesis and doctoral students.



**Keren Serebro-Sorek, MA** is a senior rehabilitation psychologist and a clinical neuropsychologist. Her educational background includes a master degree in neuropsychology from the Hebrew University in Jerusalem, an undergraduate degree in Psychology and Communication from Haifa University. Keren worked for 12 years in the National Institute for the Rehabilitation of the Brain Injured in Tel Aviv. During that time she provided psychological and cognitive rehabilitation therapy, neuropsychological assessments and managed rehabilitation programs. For the last six years Keren is the head rehabilitation psychologist at the Tel Aviv Sourasky Medical Center. At that capacity she is in

charge of rehabilitation psychologists in a variety of units at the hospital treating acute, sub-acute and chronic patients with diverse medical conditions. Keren also manages the psychological service in the rehabilitation department. Her specific fields of interest are treating PTSD, CRPS and enhancing the training and professional skills of rehabilitation psychologist staff. Keren is also a member of the IPA rehabilitation division and was head of the annual rehabilitation convention committee on the topic of trauma and rehabilitation in 2015.



**Limor Sharoni, MA** received her master degree in clinical neuropsychology from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, Israel. She has acquired expertise in rehabilitation psychology and neuropsychology. Limor is a senior psychologist at The National Institute for the Rehabilitation of the Brain Injured, a public non-profit organization dedicated to the neuropsychological and psychosocial

rehabilitation of brain-injured army veterans and civilians, established at 1975. Limor has been working at the Institute for the last 14 years. Seven years ago She established the Gesher-Galilee Center, the northern most branch of It, and has led it since. The branch provides neuropsychological assessment and psychotherapy programs to the Galilee and Golan multicultural population (Jews, Druze, Muslim Arabs, Christian Arabs), suffering acquired brain damage and Psychotherapy for PTSD patients and people with chronic Diseases. Limor also serves as ahead of Occupational assessment and consulting public unit for people after acute or chronic medical conditions. Her main interest includes Neuropsychological rehabilitation, Cognitive Rehabilitation, PTSD, PTSD and TBI co morbidity, Cultural aspects of Rehabilitation Psychology, Occupational assessment and consulting for people after acute or chronic medical conditions. Currently she apply a Ph.D candidacy concerning " PTSD after TBI- adjusted assessment and psychotherapy model", based on her clinical experience.



**Gil Suzin, MA** neuropsychologist, director of the cognitive rehabilitation unit in the Sagol center for Hyperbaric Medicine and Research at Assaf Harofeh Medical Center. Gil, specializes in cognitive rehabilitation methods for patients with neurological impairments attending Hyperbaric Oxygen Treatments (HBOT) after Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI), Cardiovascular Accident (CVA), Anoxic Brain Damage or in cases of mild dementia (i.e. Alzheimer's Disease). Gil is also interested in integrating neuropsychological assessments with neurophysiological measures based on Evoked Response Potential (ERP) and Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation (TMS). His Doctoral research is supervised by

Professor Marius Usher from Tel Aviv University. In his research, he studies aging cognition with emphasis on changing strategies of semantic encoding into visual memory.



**Amir Zendakovich, MA** is the Reuth Rehabilitation Hospital Chief Psychologist and the Director of the Reuth Rehabilitation Psychology Department. In addition to these positions, he is the Director of the hospital's Agam Institute for the Treatment and Rehabilitation of Eating Disorders. The Reuth Rehabilitation Hospital is one of Israel's leading rehabilitation and long-term medical facilities. The rehabilitation departments include three in-patient departments, neurological and orthopedic rehabilitation, and a multi-discipline day rehabilitation unit that specializes in rehabilitation of a variety of pain syndromes, including CRPS. The Agam Institute provides comprehensive professional care to adolescents and adults with anorexia, bulimia, binge eating

disorder and obesity. Amir's educational background includes Masters' degrees in Rehabilitation Neuropsychology from the Tel-Aviv Yafo Academic College, and from the Cohn Institute for the History and philosophy of science and ideas, Tel-Aviv University. As head psychologist, Amir supervises interns from the Rehabilitation Psychology Department and practicum M.A students. His research interests focus on group therapy models: applying group therapy to develop better management skills for staff burnout, and spearheading an integrative approach in group therapy for patients with eating disorders. Leaders of various organizations in Rehabilitation Psychology (American Board of Rehabilitation Psychology, the Academy of Rehabilitation Psychology, APA Division 22, the Foundation for Rehabilitation Psychology) have been engaged in talks to identify ways to maximize use of our resources and support our respective missions. From letter (Feb. 2017) “We were surprised and very concerned to learn of this new development as we were aware that a different approach had been jointly proposed by the ICD-11 Mental Health and Neurology Topic Advisory Groups and had previously been reflected on the ICD-11 beta platform. According to that proposal, the syndrome of dementia and associated psychological and behavioral symptoms would be classified under Mental and Behavioral Disorders, while the neurological disease entities that can underlie the syndrome of dementia would be classified under Diseases of the Nervous System. We understand that from a health statistics perspective, this dual-coding approach may seem complicated, but the proposed change reflects a marked divergence from ICD-9 and ICD-10 without a clear empirical justification. APA is concerned that this change is likely to result in a serious reduction in the access to and quality of care for those with dementia by precluding health care professionals from providing critically needed assessment and intervention services to this population. “

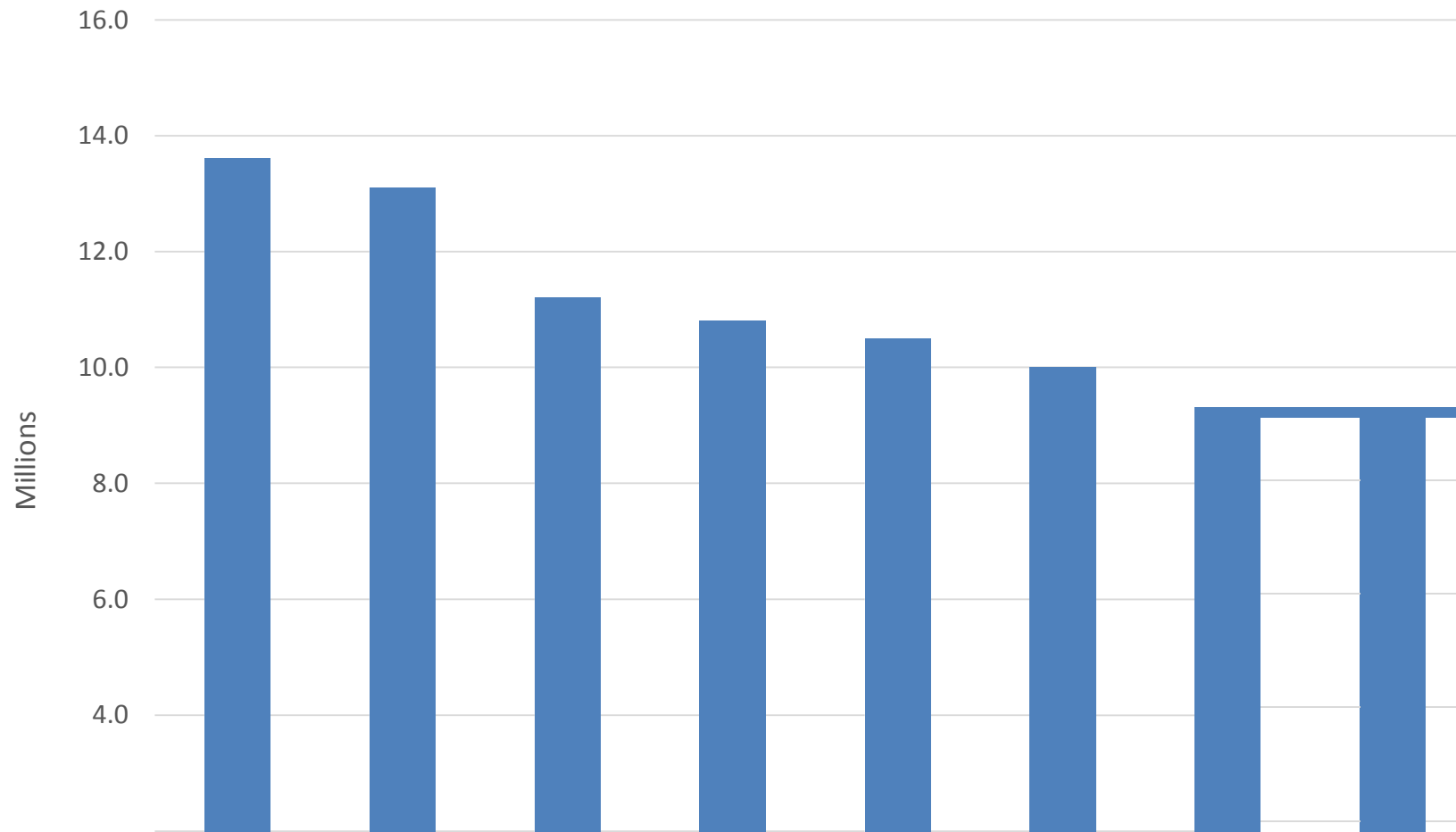

# Why Is Our Existence as Humans Still Being Denied?

In Denver in 1978, just after the July 4 holiday, 19 men and women with disabilities positioned themselves in front of public buses at the busy intersection of Colfax Avenue and Broadway. They chanted “We will ride!” until city transportation officials were willing to hear their complaints: Namely, that lack of access to public transportation led to disenfranchisement and discrimination, which led to joblessness, homelessness, despair and misery.

These pioneers, known now as the “Gang of 19,” were not simply irritating commuters by blocking the intersection all day and into the night — they were demanding to be heard, and, perhaps most important, to be *seen*. They are praised now as important activists, although news coverage at the time was far from celebratory. The protest was an early sign of progress to come, including the passage of the Americans With Disabilities Act in 1990, which established the fundamental rights of access and equal opportunity that had so long been denied this marginalized group of human beings.

Yet in late June, nearly 40 years after the Gang of 19 protests, I experienced a troubling moment of *déjà vu* as I watched disability rights activists being hauled out

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that would certainly push millions of people with disabilities out of sight and into the neglect and despair of institutions, home confinement, joblessness and poverty. I was saddened, bewildered and angered that a movement that gave so many so much more life could have come so far, only to be forced to protest the same issues all over again — basically, our right, as people with nonnormative bodies, to basic access, to our very existence.

In 1978 my parents watched live footage of the Gang of 19 protests on their television (my father remembers getting up to turn up the sound) in the weeks before my amputation, the first of six operations I would have in the next five years, from ages 4 to 9. I was born with a congenital birth defect that required amputation so that I might be fitted with a prosthetic limb; this was considered, in my case, the best shot I had at a “normal” life — which my parents viewed as an ability to work, make an impact, have mobility, be considered equal to others, even if my body was built differently. They desperately wanted this for me, and were willing to change jobs and move across the country to make it happen. It was a propitious move, as I would later become an early student in the adaptive ski program in the Rocky Mountains, an experience that, more than any other in my childhood, changed my life.

My parents had moved us close to Denver to be near Children’s Hospital, and their widely respected orthopedic surgeons on staff — one in particular, who performed every one of my many surgeries, including two of the “do-overs” when the operation didn’t yield the desired results. We were not rich by any standards — a lower-middle-class family with good health insurance — which, even so, never covered all of my operations or devices or in full. Both my parents worked two jobs on and off throughout my childhood to close the gap. My father even drove a school bus, a fact I vividly remember made me feel ashamed.

My parents must have sensed what a person — in this case, their daughter — would face, given her nonnormative body. It must have been a mix of hope and fear, of anger and elation.

Now, as a parent myself, I can imagine the mixed emotions my parents, decades younger than I am now, must have felt watching the standoff between the

Division 19 Statement - July 2017

Esteemed colleagues,

Several days ago, President Trump issued a statement indicating that transgender individuals would no longer be allowed to serve in the U.S military, reversing a 2016 decision that allowed this group to serve openly. A study completed by the Rand Corporation provided a mid-range estimate that 2,450 transgender individuals currently serve on active duty, with an additional 1,510 in the reserves. This same study indicated that between 29 and 129 of those serving on active duty would seek out medical treatment for gender transition.

In 2003, the APA Task Force on Sexual Orientation and Military Service was established, composed of members of Divisions 19 and 44, the Society for the Psychological Study of Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgender Issues. This task force recommended ending the ban, then in place against gays openly serving in the military, with Council quickly passing this recommendation as a resolution. Military psychologists within the Department of Defense (DoD) were very influential in the subsequent repeal of "Don't Ask, Don't Tell," with their research proving critical in informing policy makers. The senior author of the DoD Comprehensive Review Report was joined by several colleagues, all of whom were military psychologists and members of Division 19, in recommending to President Obama that the ban on gays and lesbians serving in the military be lifted.

Patriotism and the call to service is not dictated by gender, race, religion, sexual orientation or any of the multitude of demographics used to characterize others. One of the strengths of the military is to be found in its diversity, in the willingness of its members to serve, in the opportunity to work as a team to accomplish a common goal. As a part of that process, bridges are built and barriers are destroyed - as occurred when racial minorities and women were successfully integrated into the military - and we became stronger as a Nation. To prohibit a segment of Americans from service, regardless of the demographic used, serves to diminish us all.
